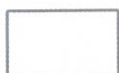


# The Meanings of the United Arab Emirates Flag Colors

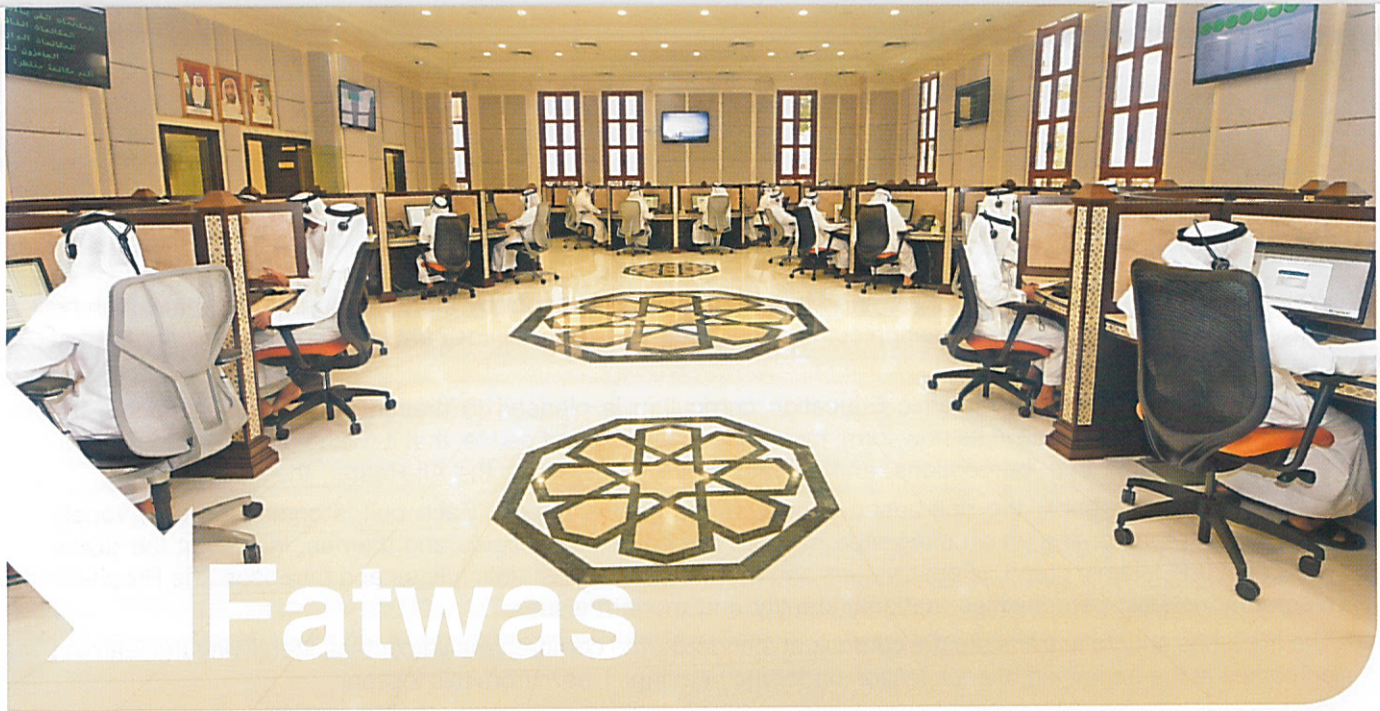

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## Introduction

Praise be to Allah, the Most Gracious, the Most Bountiful, Who taught by the pen; taught man that which he knew not. Blessings and peace be upon our Prophet, Muhammad, who was sent as a mercy to all nations, and upon his family and companions.

The Team of Authors of the Islamic Education curriculum is pleased to present to our dear students the Islamic Education textbook in its new form, praying to Allah, Exalted be He, that it will help them increase their knowledge, expand their perceptions, and elevate their morals; He is the All-Hearer, the All-Answerer.

In constructing the book, the unit-based approach has been adopted. Each unit is comprised of a variety of subjects, representing, in an integrated manner, the curriculum's fields and themes, including: the divine revelation; the Islamic creed; Islamic values and moral teachings; Islamic rulings and purposes; the Prophet's biography; Islamic personalities; national identity and modern issues.

The book has sought to translate the curriculum standards into comprehensive content, identifying the learning outcomes at the beginning of each lesson under the heading: 'I learn from this lesson.'

Each lesson consists of an introduction entitled: 'I take the initiative to learn'; a presentation under the title: 'I use my skills to learn'; and a conclusion entitled: 'I organize my concepts'.

The students' activities focus on three specific types: general activities for all students under the heading: 'I answer on my own'; enrichment activities for distinguished students titled: 'Enriching my experience; and applied activities entitled: "I assess myself".

The book strikes a balance between religious knowledge and educational activities by providing students with the necessary Islamic knowledge and concepts. At the same time, it has allowed them the opportunity of enriching and broadening their knowledge through class learning activities.

The book aims to realize the attributes of Emirati students, strengthen their loyalty and belonging to their homeland, protect them from the ideas of extremism and terrorism; develop the skills of thinking in particular, and those of the 21st century in general; and achieve the requirements of sustainable development.

The book focuses on the religious knowledge and concepts that students need to acquire. It links them to contemporary life in accordance with the teachings of Islam, which are based on the concepts of moderation, balance, tolerance, love, peace, cohesion, harmony, respect for human dignity, renunciation of violence and hatred, positivity, and individual and communal responsibility. Moreover, the book attaches importance to developing performance skills that relate to Islamic education and has given special emphasis to Islamic values in order to build conscious personalities that adhere to their religion, and take pride in their heritage, contribute to nation building and open new horizons of cooperation to promote common human values.

**Mother:** Today, my children, let's read about the Messengers, peace be upon them. What do you say?

**Noura:** Yes, mother. I want to know who the Messengers are, their number and the message which Allah, glory be to Him, wanted them to convey.

**Mother:** Allah, Glorified and Exalted be He, has chosen His Messengers and bestowed His care and protection upon them. He made them infallible and of the most perfect moral characters. Allah, glory be to Him, sent them to guide people to worship Him alone, to do good deeds and to spread justice and peace on earth. ## The Story of our Master Nuh (Noah), peace be upon him



Nuh (Noah), peace be upon him, was a very pious and truthful man. He was sent by Allah, glory be to Him, to his people in order to call upon them to worship Allah alone, and to give up worshipping stone-idols that could neither harm nor benefit them in any way. Nuh (Noah), peace be upon him, began calling his people to respond to the orders of Allah, glory be to Him. But they refused and continued worshipping idols. They even abused and mocked him.

For long ۹۵۰ years, Nuh (Noah), peace be upon him, was steadfast on the truth and continued preaching the message of Allah, glory be to Him. He showed patience in the face of harm and humiliation. But only a few of his people believed in him.

Nuh (Noah), peace be upon him, felt very sad and suffered a severe pain. He complained to his Lord about the response he received from his people. Allah, glory be to Him, ordered him to build an ark (a ship), which is to carry the believers and a male and female of every kind of animal. Few days later, a mighty flood of water came and covered the earth and everything on it.

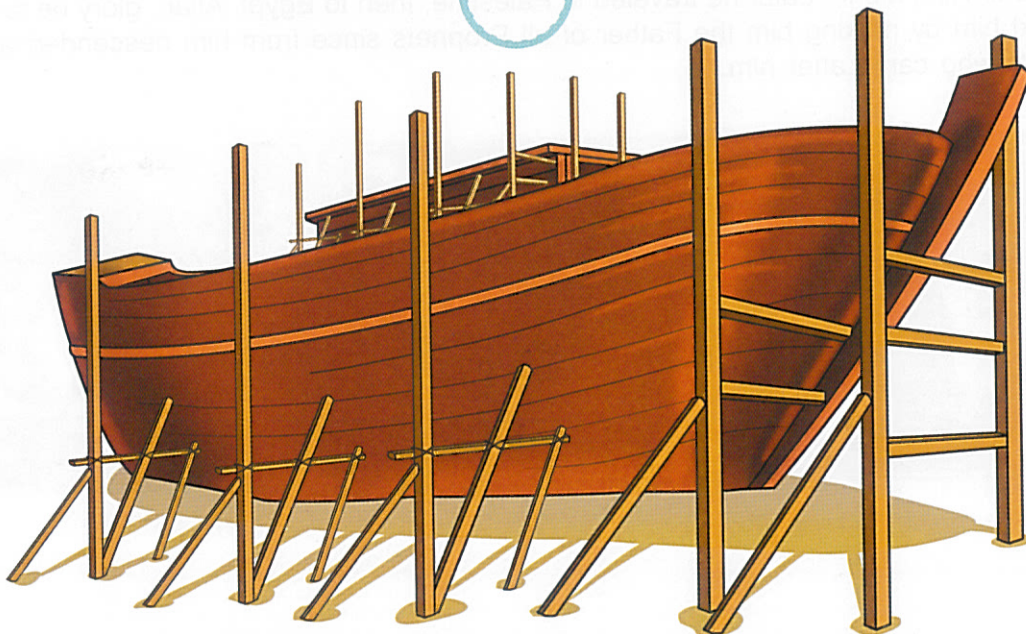
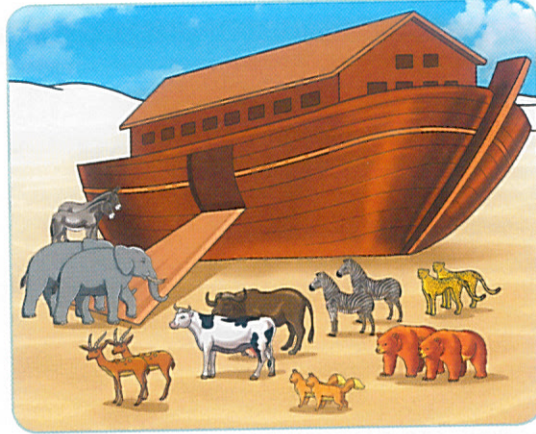
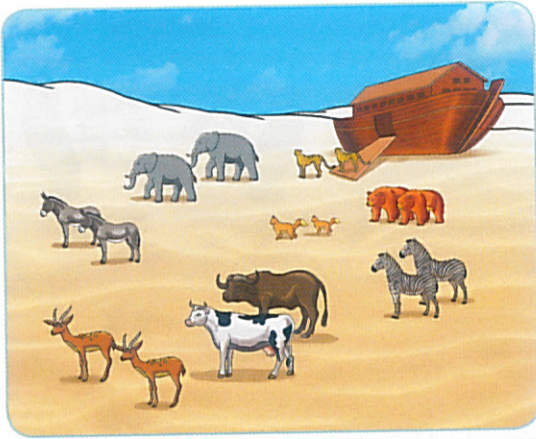

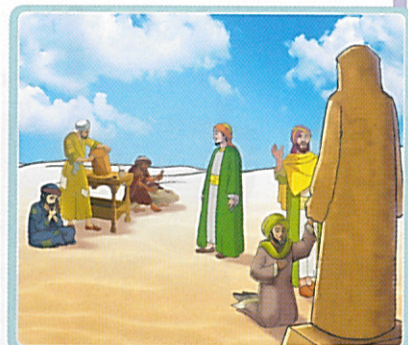
## The Story of our Master Ibrahim (Abraham), peace be upon him



Ibrahim (Abraham), peace be upon him, was born in Iraq. His people used to worship stone-idols, stars and planets. But he never worshiped nor prostrated to these idols. Ibrahim (Abraham), peace be upon him, was an intelligent and wise man. He invited his people to think deeply of the creation of the heavens and the earth and to resort to reason and think to realize who deserves to be worshipped. He, peace be upon him, used a practical argument to prove the weakness and disability of statues that cannot benefit or harm them in anyway. He went to the arena of the stone-idols and smashed them except the biggest of them on which he hung his ax. He did this to convince his people of the stone-idols' inability to defend themselves. But they insisted on their stubbornness; they even set a fire and Ibrahim was thrown into it. Allah, glory be to Him, ordered the fire to be cool and safe for him. Thus, it did not burn him. They were totally surprised when he came out of the fire as soundly as he entered it.

- teaching him the correct way to cleanse these parts.

Purity means the cleanliness of the body, dress and place for the performance of certain acts of worship, such as prayer. It is a basic condition of prayer without which the prayer is not valid.

Besides, purity is one of the signs of the believers who enjoy the love of Allah, glory be to Him. For Allah, glory be to Him, loves those who turn to Him constantly and those who keep themselves pure and clean.

Nullifiers of ablution (Wudoo') are the actions which negatively affect ablution (Wudoo') and spoil it.

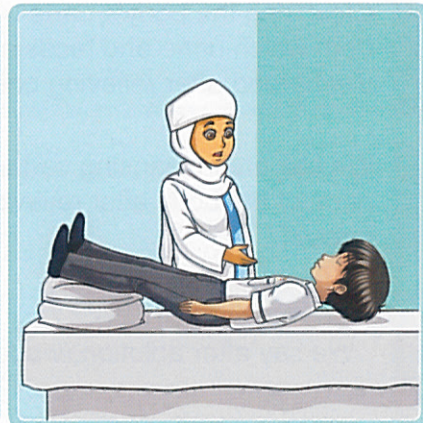

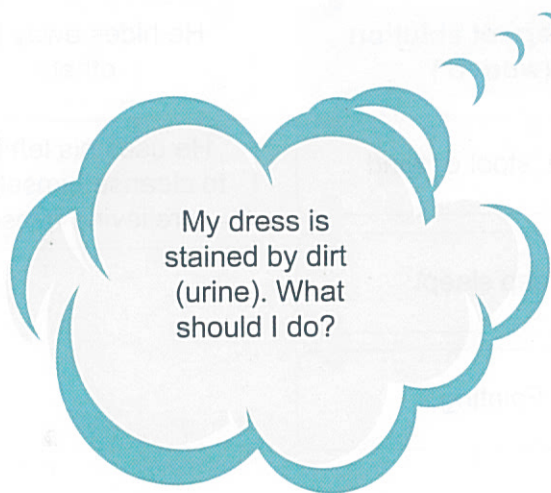

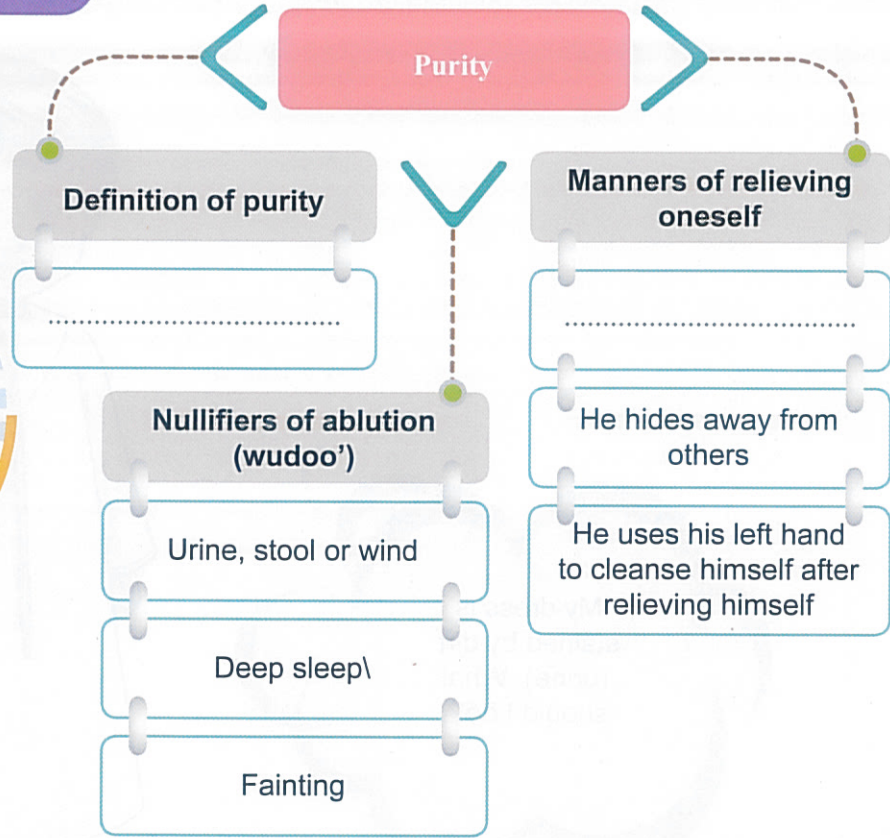

The Al-Hamra' Palace in Granada, Andalusia (Spain today).

2



The Palace was located in a high area. The big challenge was how water could be channeled to this high place from the nearby mountains.

3



Muslims decided to divert the flow of a whole river towards the Al-Hamra' Palace. They built a dam to hold the water coming from the mountains.

4



Besides, they built a huge, 1-kilometer-long water channel. The "Royal Channel" was also built to provide the Al-Hamra' Palace with water.

"You have to come back home faster next time," said the grandfather.



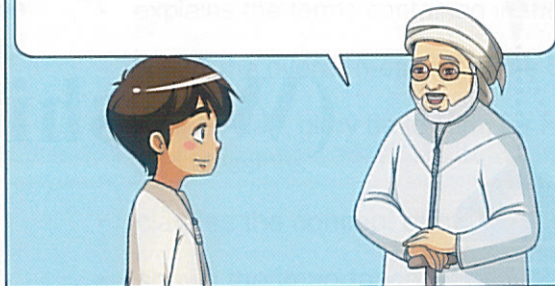




"But I do not want a bucket of water. What I want is a basket filled with water. You seem to have made no enough effort, my son," said the grandfather.



The grandson said: "It is impossible to fill the basket with water. May I bring the bucket and fill it with water? What do you think?"



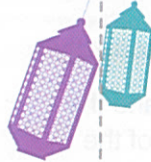

### Honorable Hadith

It was narrated by Abu Hurairah, may Allah be pleased with him, that the Messenger of Allah, peace be upon him, said: "Do you think that if there was a river by the door of any one of you, and he bathed in it five times each day, would there be any trace of dirt left on him?" They said: 'No trace of dirt would be left on him.' He said: "That is the likeness of the five daily prayers. By means of them Allah erases sins." (Agreed upon)

I explain the meanings of the following terms:

Trace of dirt: > The dirt that is cleaned with water

Sins: > The bad deeds

I read the overall meaning of the Honorable Hadith:

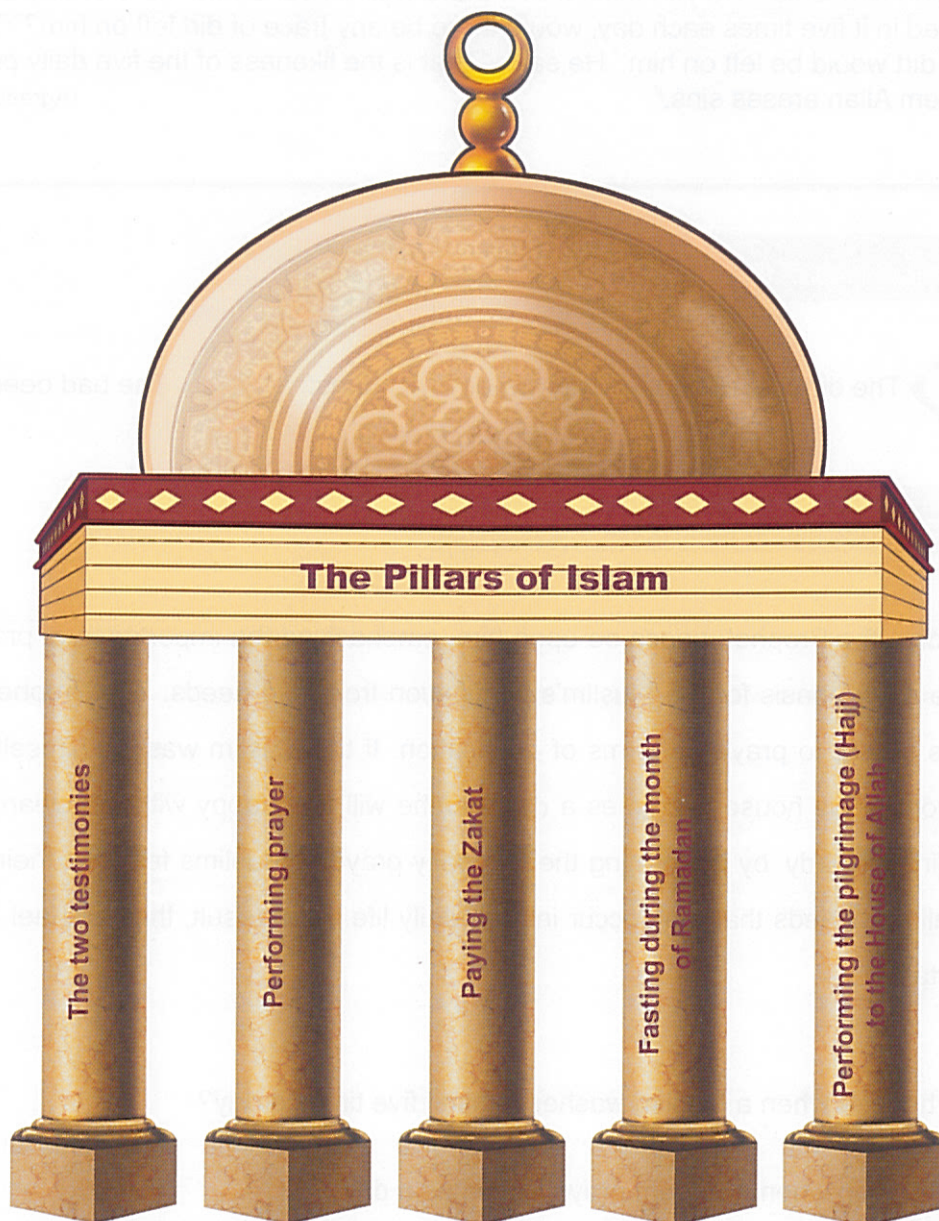
In this Hadith, the Prophet, peace be upon him, emphasized the importance of prayer in the Muslim's life as the basis for the Muslim's purification from bad deeds. The Prophet stressed that water is similar to prayer in terms of purification. If the Muslim washes himself in a river flowing in front of his house five times a day, he/she will feel happy with the cleanliness that leaves no dirt. Similarly, by performing the five daily prayers, Muslims feel that their souls are purified of all bad deeds that may occur in their daily life. As a result, they will feel calm, safe and comfortable.

The grandmother sat with Noura and Rashid waiting for the rest of the family members to hold their usual meeting every Friday night. Noura and Rashid were playing a game on the smart board. They reached the point where they had to identify the two qualities of truthfulness and honesty. They were confused about who would deserve these two characteristics.

Their grandmother smiled while listening to their conversation.



Rashid: Can you help us, grandmother?



Grandmother: Yes, my sons. What are you looking for?



Rashid: We are looking for the one who could have the title of "The Truthful, the Honest."



Grandmother: He is our beloved Muhammad, peace be upon him. Since his youth, he was the best example of proper ethical and moral behavior. He was truthful, honest and never lied.



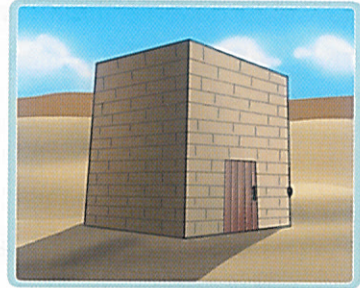
Noura: How was he honest?



Grandmother: The people of Makkah used to keep their money with him. He was keen on returning back the money in full to its owners when they asked for it. Before his Prophethood, he was known among his people as "the truthful, the honest" - a title which they conferred upon him.



When they started building the Kaaba, the Qurayshi tribes could not agree on which one of them should have the honor of setting the Black Stone in its place. The dispute lasted for 3-4 nights during which tribes of Quraysh conducted consultations over this issue. One of their elders proposed that the first man to come to their meeting would be asked to decide in this matter. And it was the Messenger of Allah, peace be upon him, the first to enter the meeting of the tribes. When they saw him they shouted, "This is the honest one... This is Muhammad. We are satisfied."

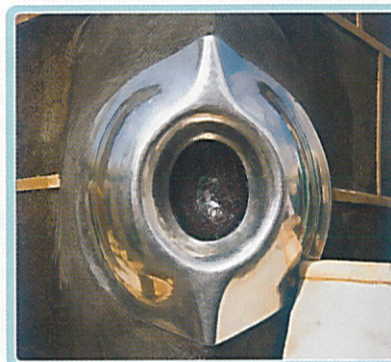

When he reached them, they told him about the matter. He, peace be upon him, said: "Bring me a robe." He took the Black Stone and placed it himself on the robe. He asked a representative from each of the tribes to hold on one side of the robe. They lifted it all up until they arrived at its place. Then the Prophet, peace be upon him, picked up the Stone with his own hand and put it in its place. After that they completed the construction of the Kaaba.



Rashid: that was a very clever solution of him, peace be upon him. He managed to solve the problem easily.



Grandmother: Yes. They were satisfied by his decision; he was known for his truthfulness and honesty, my children. I call upon you to enhance your morals. The one who has good manners and morals will enjoy people's respect and love.

## The Sacred Houses of Allah



### The Grand Mosque

(Arabic: المسجد الحرام Al-Masjid Al-Haram)

It is the Allah's Holy House that praying in which is better than one hundred thousand prayers in any other masjid.



The Mosque is located in Makkah Al-Mukarramah,  
Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.



### The Stone

The Stone of Ismail (Arabic: حِجْرُ إِسْمَاعِيلِ Hijr Ismail, or الحَظِيمِ Al-Hateem) is a semi-circular wall located to the north of the Holy Kaaba.



### The Shrine of Ibrahim (Abraham)

It is the stone upon which Ibrahim (Abraham), peace be upon him, stood when the Holy Kaaba was built.



### The Black Stone

It is a stone sent from Paradise situated on the southern corner of the Holy Kaaba to the left of its Gate.



### The Yamani Corner

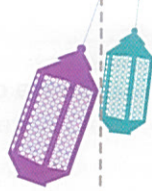
It is the Holy Kaaba's south-west corner. It is called the Yamani Corner because it is situated on the side of the Holy Kaaba which faces the land of Yemen. One of the main characteristics of this Corner is that, according to the Prophetic Way (Sunnah), the Muslim when passing it during the tawaaf (Arabic: طواف [going round the Holy Kaaba seven times in a defined manner during the Hajj]) should say the following supplication (du'aa): "Our Lord, grant us the good of this world and that of the Hereafter and save us from the torture of Hell."



### The Multazam

Al-Multazam (Arabic: الملتزم) is the roughly two-meter space along the wall between the Black Stone and the Holy Kaaba's entry Gate. It is considered a place where supplications (du'aas) are answered. According to the Prophetic Way (Sunnah), it is desirable to perform supplications (du'aas) there.

Allah, glory be to Him, bestowed many blessings upon the people of Quraysh so that they could live in peace and agreement with one another in their homeland. They were able to travel at ease to all Arab areas and return safe to their country. Thanks to their high status as residents of the holy places, they earned the respect of other people. Traders and merchants from other tribes resorted to the merchants of Makkah to deposit their goods and took part in their trade trips.

Therefore, Makkah became an important commercial center where goods and commodities are brought from all Arab countries. Thus, the people of Makkah were self-sufficient with their trading activities, even though they lived in a valley where no plants can be grown. In addition, the construction of the Kaaba and the Grand Mosque, and the practice of the pilgrimage rituals in Makkah had strengthened other people's respect and appreciation for the people of Makkah.

In this Surah, Allah, glory be to Him, reminds the people of Makkah of all these blessings and orders them to worship the Lord of the Holy House (the Kaaba) to express their thanks and praise for him.

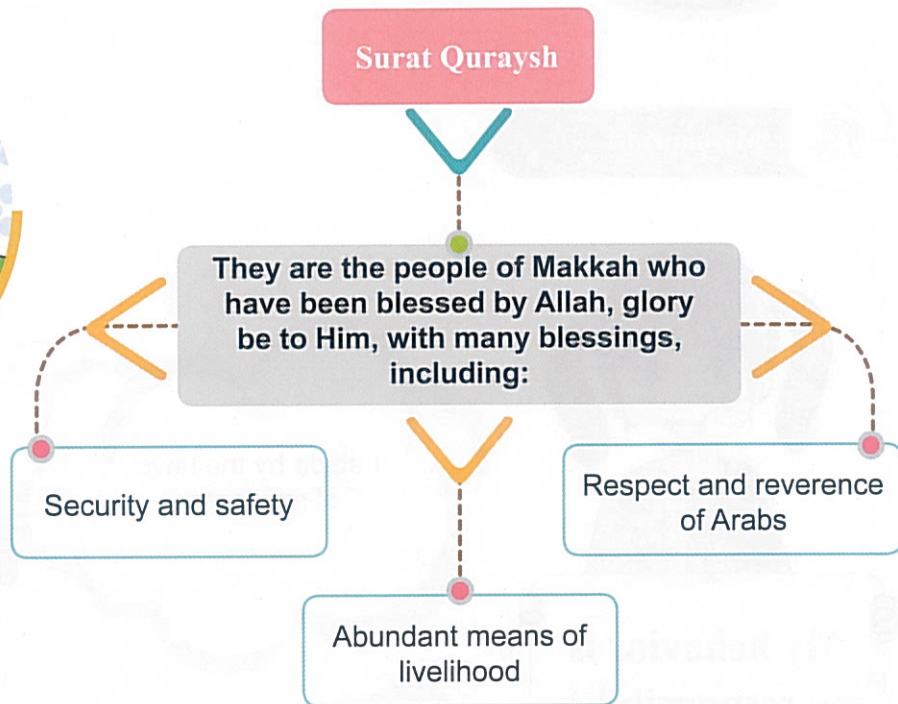

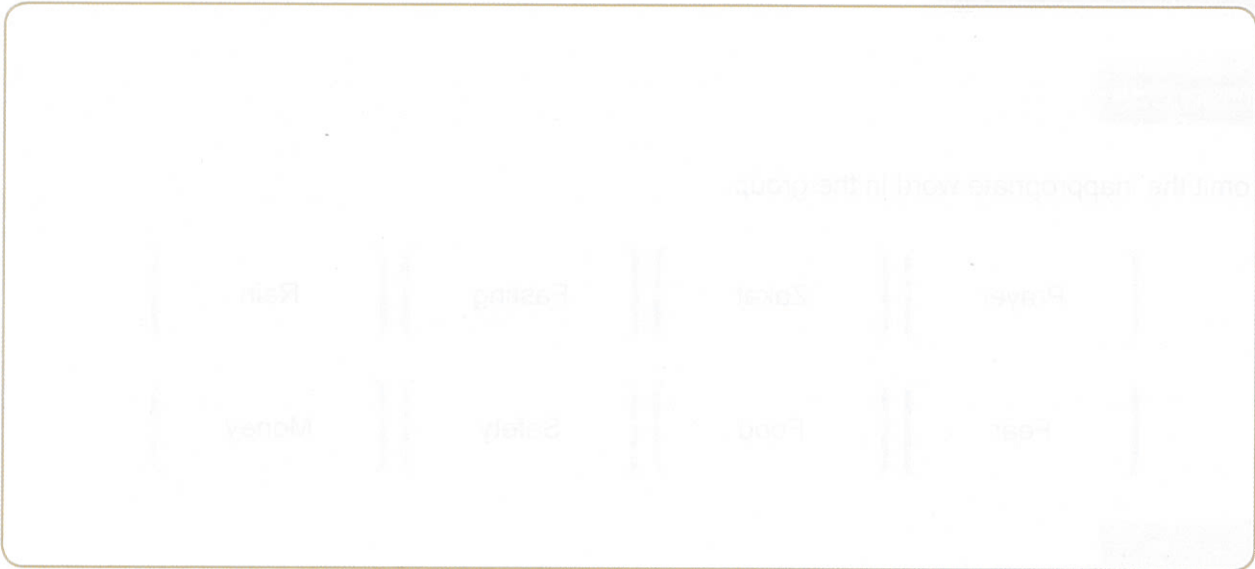

# Honesty

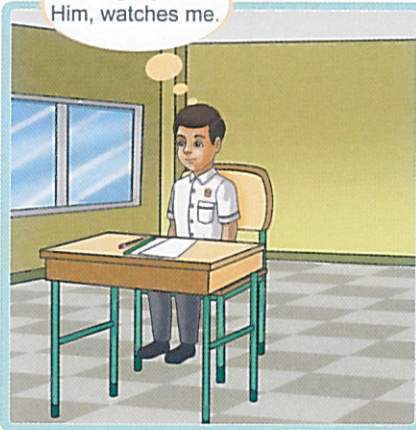

Therefore, he urged us to return trusts and deposits to their owners.

- 2 Jasim performed Al-Dhuhr (Noon) prayer with four rak'ahs. In the first two rak'ahs he recited Surat Al-Fatihah in addition to a short Surah. He sat down and read the tashahhud. Then he stood up to perform the third and fourth rak'ahs, during which he recited Surat Al-Fatihah only. He sat down to recite the last tashahhud and the Abrahamic prayer. Finally, he read the tasleem.

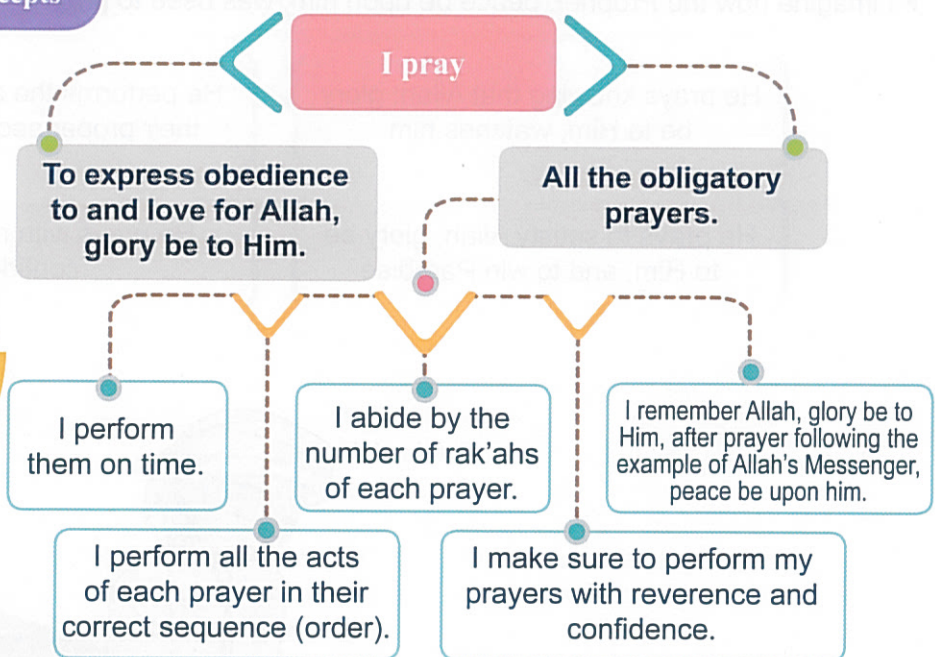
